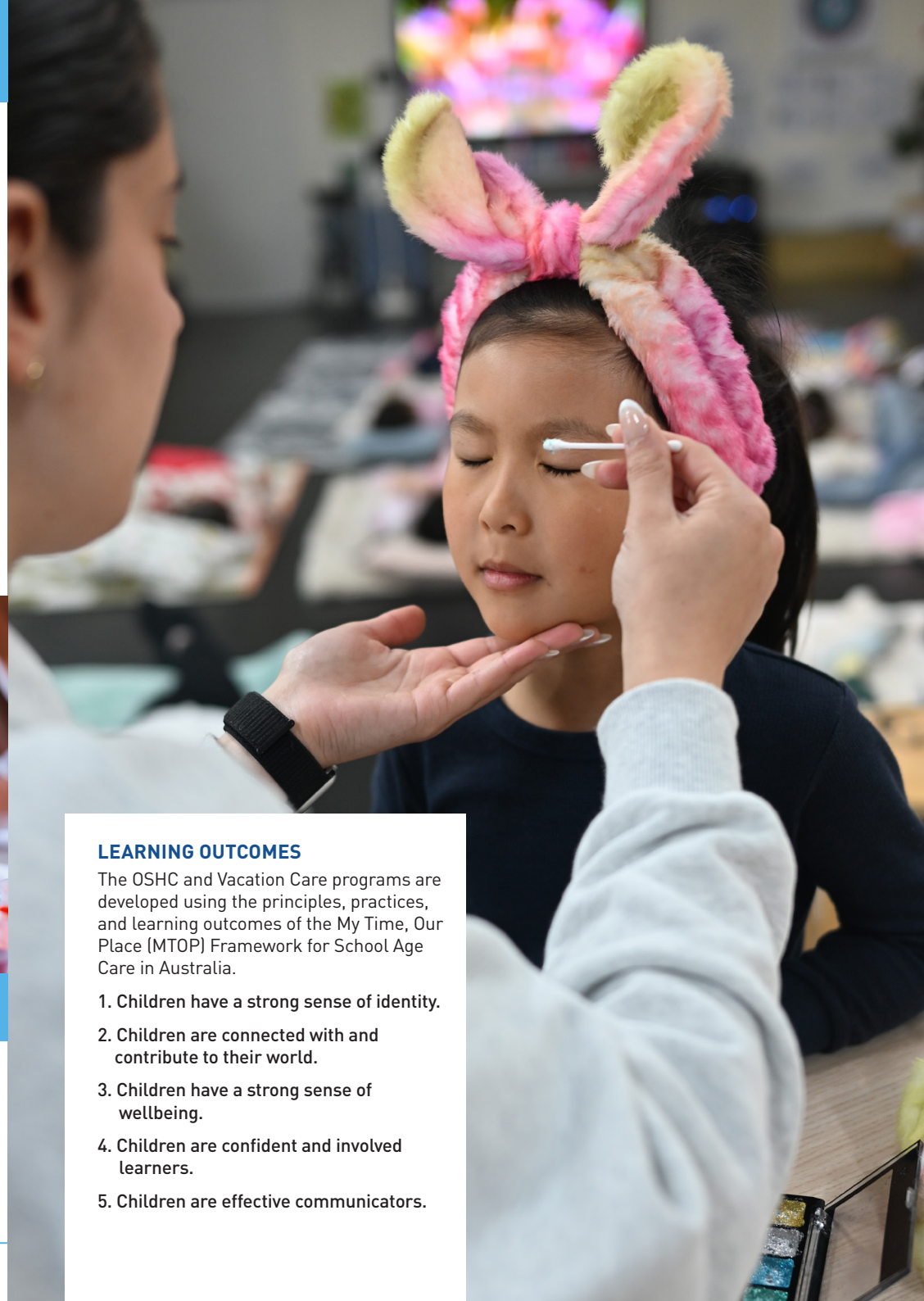

BOOKINGS

Please book early as places are limited.

Once available places have been filled your child will be placed on a waiting list. If a cancellation occurs, you will be contacted.

Submission of booking does not guarantee your booking has been accepted and finalised. All submission will be finalised and confirmed via email from the Director of OSHC, An Nguyen.

WHAT TO BRING

Children will need to bring their own hat, recess, lunch and water bottle each day. A healthy afternoon snack will be provided.

Due to allergies, parents are asked to provide snacks and lunch that do not contain nuts.

Please make sure your child has applied sunscreen prior to their arrival on high UV rating days. Staff will reapply at appropriate intervals.

We request children not to bring their own toys/games to Vacation Care unless advised by staff for special days. Hand held electronic devices, and smart watches are not permitted at the service.

EXCURSIONS

We request children not to bring money to purchase gifts or food on excursions unless the Director of OSHC has advised families to do so.
